This is The Duke of Wellington's home in the country, given to him by the Government after his success at Waterloo. He was expected to pull it down and build another Blenheim Palace-style house. But Wellington actually liked the house as it was, homely and restful. His heirs shared his love for the house and estate and are still residing here. At certain times of the year - this varies from year to year - when the family is off on holiday, the place is opened to the public with guided tours. You will be visiting a real home with a history going back to 1817. But you will also be able to marvel at the duke's funeral carriage, a sight to behold, cast from Napoleon's cannons left behind on the battlefield. The estate offers an opportunity to stretch your legs and explore. Booking opens on Tuesday 16 April '24. Price to follow.

TASA successfully applied for the £250 Community Grant for 2024. We are delighted that the beneficiary of this grant is the Littlehampton Child Contact Centre, which was proposed as a recipient by one of our members.

This charity does incredible work, providing a safe, friendly, supervised and child focused environment where non-resident parents can spend time with their children. The centre is run by voluntary staff, who do an amazing job.

The art and craft resources of the centre are very limited, and the grant will be used to provide age related art and craft bags for each family. The experience of producing an art project together can be very fulfilling for parents and children alike, as well as making a memento of their time spent together.

We also hope to deliver an art orientated session for the volunteers. This would be a bit of light relief on one of their often very gruelling training days.
