

# Regency Town House in Hove

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The Regency Town House at 13 Brunswick Square, Hove BN3 1EH, is a grade 1 listed terraced home in the heart of Brunswick Town, a Georgian estate.

Built in the 1820s, the Town House is today being developed by staff and volunteers as a heritage centre and museum. Its activities are funded through The Brunswick Town Charitable Trust, a registered charity set up to support the project in 1994.

Years of accumulated paint layers have been removed; plasterwork and mouldings have been repaired and original finishes have been analysed and recreated. This gives provides an insight into the building materials and techniques that were used in the past and allows us to keep that expertise alive today as we learn how to recreate them.

To support the restoration process our volunteers organize fund-raising events, including workshops, performances, readings and recitals. The Town House rooms can be hired for art and photography exhibitions and events such as readings, book launches, and other small functions.

On your tour you will learn more about the Regency period (when George, Prince of Wales, took over the duties from his father, the 'mad' King George III), the architectural and decorative features of this House, which are an example of the confidence, sophistication and wealth associated with this style and period, and the restoration process.
